


THE GOODS SHED ARTS CENTRE

Tetbury's former railway goods shed is being transformed into an arts centre for the people of the town and surrounding area. While maintaining the historic and much-loved Victorian exterior, the interior has been fully modernised with under-floor heating, double glazing and insulation

The open interior has been retained and, when the fully retractable seating is installed around Easter 2017, it will be possible to convert from an open dance floor or art exhibition space into a comfortable theatre, concert hall or cinema at the push of a button.

TRLRT's vision is for the Goods Shed to become a regional centre of excellence for the arts while at the same time fulfilling the local need for arts and entertainment. The cinema, with a programme of films aimed at all age groups, will provide the town with a new source of regular entertainment. Musical performances will cover the full spectrum including dance events.

There will be dramatic performances by visiting artists. At the heart of the Goods Shed vision is the ambition to encourage and capitalise on local talent. There will be plenty of opportunity for local artists, clubs and societies to use the facilities, either to perform for the public or just to enjoy participating in the arts.
